

News from Glentworth Parish Council

Glentworth Parish Council has met a couple of times since the last update and some of the projects that we've been working on have made progress since then.

- Play park we have now selected some new play equipment to replace the existing and are starting to look for the funding to make this happen. The supplier, Lars UK, have been really helpful and have made a range of new equipment at a really good price, but we will still need to make some funding applications for about £25,000 to raise the balance of the money we need. There will be some pictures of the new play area equipment on display in the Village Hall shortly and we'll keep you up to date with how the funding applications are going.
- Northlands Road Track I am sure residents in the village have noticed the changes that have been made to the track in front of Glentworth Hall. Thanks to Glentworth Scottish Farms we have seen some new surfacing material put down and the troughs at either end have stopped the problem of vehicles using this footpath as a shortcut through the village.
- Pocket Park we're in touch with the Wildlife Trust to get their advice on work to the pocket park, clearing out the pond and generally tidying the area up. We're also thinking about creating some wildflower areas in and around the village, to encourage bees and other insects and also to bring some colour to verges, etc.

In addition to these projects, the Parish Council is still trying to get the footpath to Harpswell re-opened, is monitoring the reports from the speed indicator on Hannover Hill and exploring options to bring better Broadband to Glentworth.

Future plans - there has been some discussion about the Parish Council buying some additional benches to be put around the village. We will be canvassing for ideas about where these would be most useful, so watch out for this in the coming weeks.

Hall Happenings

We're delighted to welcome scarecrows back to the village on September 11th for the GREAT GLENTWORTH SCARECROW FESTIVAL. This year's theme is "Books and their Characters" so come along and see if you can tell your Gruffalo from your Mr Darcy.

September also marks the return of more activities to the Village Hall - Paige Pritchard's Dance School, Pilates and Short Mat Bowls. Anyone interested in giving bowls a try can do so for free at one of their weekly sessions. Also, we have just bought some new badminton rackets, if you fancy hiring the Hall for a game or two - contact the Village Hall on 07966 153878 for more details.

Ingham Parish Council Update

This update is based on decisions and updates at the last meeting of the Parish Council on 5th July. You can find the most recent agreed minutes on the Parish Council website https://ingham.parish.lincolnshire.gov.uk and the Parish Council noticeboard.

The Parish Council have received the resignation of Councillor Buck. Councillors thank him for his hard work and dedication to the role as Councillor and prior to this, Village Caretaker. As a result, there is a vacancy for a Councillor on the Parish Council. The District Council have been notified and a formal vacancy notice has been displayed on the Parish Council website and noticeboards in the village. There were no applicants and therefore the Parish Council will now seek to co-opt a Councillor. A parishioner must fulfil one of the following criteria to qualify:

- Registered as a local government elector for the Parish on the current Electoral Register
- Has during the whole of the previous 12 months occupied as tenant or owner of any land or other premises in the Parish.
- His/her principal or only place of work in the previous 12 months has been in the Parish
- Has resided either in the Parish or within 4.8 kilometres (3 miles) thereof during the previous 12 months

The speed sign settings have been adjusted recently so a 'SLOW DOWN' message should only display if a vehicle is travelling over 30mph. The sign has been at the bottom of Church Hill and continues to record some very high speeds at times, such as 64mph in June. The average speed has decreased slightly from 34.19 mph in April to 33.4mph recently. The sign has now been re-positioned to Lincoln Road for the summer period. Parishioners are asked to adhere to the speed limits in and around the village to protect others and yourselves.

Recreation area project: The draft tender document was discussed and approved by the Parish Council. The formal tender process has now started with the tender advertised on the Contracts Finder database. Responses have been requested from providers by 11th September 2021. The Parish Council have earmarked c. £18k of reserves to be used for the project with a sizeable remainder required from other funding sources.

The operational safety of the play equipment in the play park is reviewed regularly by the Clerk and there are no current operational concerns. Wicksteed have completed the annual risk assessment of the equipment too and found no significant faults. The defibrillators at the Village Hall and Ingham Practice are both 'emergency ready'.

Financial matters: The Parish Council approved payments to Hilltop Tree Services for removing a diseased tree from the playing field at short notice; payments to Green Grass Contracting for grass cuts between April and May and reimbursement to the Village Caretaker for repairs to the small climbing frame in the play park.

LCC Highways matters: Changes to the speed restriction at the Crossways junction are awaited along with improved signage. Works to cut back the hedge and trees on Grange Lane adjacent to Grange Close have been scheduled. Footpath markings have been requested outside of 16 High Street. A proposal for improved parking arrangements close to the junction of High Street and Lincoln Road has also been made to LCC Highways.

Neighbourhood Plan: The Parish Council aim to hold public events to receive resident's feedback about the sites' assessments for Ingham as soon as possible. A grant has successfully been offered by Locality to cover the costs of the plan this year.

The Parish Council have been invited to consult on the revised Central Lincolnshire Local (Continued on page 24)

RAF Scampton Commemorative Stained Glass Window

Scampton Church has been the church of RAF Scampton since 1916 when the station was a Royal Flying Corps station (later becoming RAF Scampton in 1918).

The Ministry of Defence has announced that it intends to decommission the RAF station on the 31^{st} December 2022.

A project to commission a stunning RAF stained glass window at Scampton Church to mark our 100 years' historical relationship with RAF Scampton (1918 - 2018) is now complete. The window contains 380 pieces of hand painted glass, and has taken 2 years to complete. It is intended that the window will create a lasting memory to all who served at the station, both in peacetime, during the two world





wars and the cold war.

The window has been designed and created by Claire Williamson, a specialist in traditional and modern stained glasswork. following consultations with RAF Scampton and the local community. The design is contemporary; with the Scampton badge RAF forming a central part of the design, alongside the

winged RAF badge (Per Ardua Ad Astra) which sits proudly on the 107 Commonwealth War and Service Graves in the churchyard. The design also includes representations of three of the iconic aircraft which have flown from the station: the Avro Lancaster, Avro Vulcan and the Red Arrows Hawk Jets in a diamond nine formation; all depicted flying over the airfield at RAF Scampton.

The inscription on the window was chosen by Wing Commander James Parker who was the officer commanding at RAF Scampton at the design stage, and reads:

"To commemorate those who served in squadrons based at RAF Scampton 1918 – 2018"



The window is crowned, in a rose window, by a dove carrying an olive branch, signifying the hope that the peace of Christ, which calls each of us to live out every day, will put an end to war.

The window also conveys other subtle messages:

The RAF badge is surmounted by the King's crown which mirrors the RAF badges on the war graves in the churchyard.

There are no markings on the Lancaster and Vulcan in order that they represent all Lancaster and Vulcan crews who flew from Scampton.

The tracers from the Red Arrows join both windows together.

around the Vulcan represents the kink in the A15 around the end of the runway.

Also included in the initiative is an associated remembrance, arts, and history project which



will take place in Scampton's two local primary schools this summer. This project is being run by Claire Williamson, The Battle of Britain Memorial Flight, The Lincolnshire



Lancaster Association, RAF Scampton Heritage Centre and Scampton Church. As well as glass tile making skills, it will also teach 200 children the

history of the station and of the


sacrifices given to ensure they live in a free and democratic country.

FRESH from ALISON'S KITCHEN

Here's a suitable dish to have towards the end of the summer. In Alison's kitchen we have tweaked this old favourite by making a tasty yet creamy dressing out of roasting garlic and blending with fat-free yogurt. This variation on a theme, inspired by the British Heart Foundation, has a fraction of the fat of a traditional Caesar dressing.

Ingredients:

- •2 chicken breasts
- •1/2 tsp cumin seeds
- •1/2 tsp smoked paprika
- •200g tomatoes, halved
- •4 cloves garlic, peeled
- •3 sprigs fresh thyme
- •50g (2oz) slice ciabatta bread or any other rustic loaf
- •1 tsp rapeseed oil
- •1 small head cos lettuce, thickly shredded
- •3 tbsp fat-free Greek style natural yogurt
- •Freshly ground black pepper



Method:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 200oC/180o fan/Gas 6. Line a baking tray with nonstick baking parchment. Mix together the cumin and paprika and rub over both sides of the chicken breasts. Place onto one side of the baking tray.
- 2. Add the tomato halves to the other side of the tray cut side up, add the garlic cloves between the tomatoes and lay the thyme sprigs on top. Cook for 25 minutes.
- 3. Brush both sides of the bread with the oil, then cut into cubes. Add to the oven for the last 10 minutes of cooking time.
- 4. Carefully lift the chicken onto a board and slice on the diagonal. Pile into a serving bowl. Add the tomatoes to the chicken.
- 5. Place the cooked garlic into a small blender, add the yoghurt and any cooking juices from the tomatoes and blitz to a smooth dressing. Season with black pepper.



6. Add the lettuce to the chicken and tomatoes and toss well. Drizzle with the dressing and scatter with croutons.


