News from Glentworth Parish Council

The Parish Council have received the conclusion of the external audit of parish accounts and processes for 2020/21 and we are pleased to say that there have been no comments. The notice of conclusion is currently displayed on the parish noticeboard and website.

The annual play area inspection of play equipment in the village has been undertaken by ROSPA which have found no significant issues. Clearly some parts of equipment have been removed for safety reasons. The recreation area project will deliver a complete replacement of equipment, except for the swings, with a large multi play item, a fisher boat and sommersault bars. There will also be the addition of seating and picnic tables. The Parish Council are currently in the process of applying for funding.

The Parish Council thank Glentworth Scottish Farms for the improvements made recently to the Northlands Road track. The introduction of troughs at each end has not only provided a deterrent to vehicles using the track but also provided an opportunity to fill them with flowers.

We continue to work on the reinstatement of a footpath to Harpswell. The request to the County Council is low on the priority list and progress is not quick. We are therefore in the process of appealing to the Secretary of State to assist.

Lincolnshire County Council Highways have made a number of pot hole repairs in the village. They will also be making repairs to Kexby Road, West of Church Street, between 5/11 and 9/11. We have also requested an improvement to the road edge of Coachroad Hill.

As you may be aware, the defibrillator cabinet outside the Village Hall developed a fault and was therefore removed from the EMAS database temporarily while a replacement was sourced. I am delighted to say the West Lindsey District Council have provided a replacement cabinet and defibrillator which are now emergency ready. This is in addition to the recently installed defibrillator on Hawthorne Close. We hope to be able to arrange some community training in due course.

The Parish Council are also looking at introducing extra seating and litter bins around the village. If you have any preference for locations then please let the Clerk or a Councillor know. We are also looking into areas where wildflowers can be planted.

Finally, we have been made aware that there are plans to introduce 2 solar farms on land near to Cottam and West Burton power stations. The proposed sites are located close to us and other local villages. A consultation will begin in due course.

Ingham Parish Council Update

This update is based on decisions and updates at the last meeting of the Parish Council on 11^h October. You can find the most recent agreed minutes on the Parish Council website <u>https://ingham.parish.lincolnshire.gov.uk</u> and the Parish Council noticeboard.

The speed sign is currently positioned on Lincoln Road and the average speed in September was 27.7mph. Thank you to all of you who continue to adhere to the speed limit in the village.

Recreation area project: Following the receipt of tender responses, funding applications are being completed to try to raise enough to cover the £100,000 cost. This is expected to be very competitive with very few funding options being available to Parish Council currently however, we Are hopeful we will be successful.

Financial matters: The Parish Council approved payments to Green Grass Contracting for the grass cut in September and for the cost of two wreaths for Remembrance Day. The Remembrance Day Civic Event is expected to be limited to a small gathering around the war memorial this year.

Highways: Lincolnshire County Council Highways have recently undertaken works to fill pot holes around the village, fill pot holes on Ingham Lane and drainage works on West End. The Parish Council have asked them to assess the road across the Green from West End as this is very uneven. Hedge cutting works are also scheduled for the hedge on Grange Lane, close to Grange Close. County Councillor Butroid is also supporting our request to extend the scope of the 30mph zone around the Crossways junction and implement a white line to demarcate a footpath outside 14 High Street.

Lincolnshire County Council have offered trees for the village as part of the Treescapes scheme. The Clerk has met with the Environment and Community Projects Officer and locations have been agreed for six new trees. These are expected to be planted by February 2022 in areas including the playing field and adjacent to the Parish Council noticeboard.

A Christmas Tree has been ordered for the village and this should be erected in its usual location close to the Book Exchange in early December and a Christmas Tree lighting ceremony is being arranged.

The Parish Council have returned comments to West Lindsey District Council Planning about a planning application for a poultry farm, close to Plum Products between the B1398 and A15. If parishioners would like to find out more about this application you can find details at www.west-lindsey.gov.uk/planning (143510).

The Parish Council have also been made aware of plans to install 2 large solar farms in various locations around Cottam and West Burton power stations. Some of these are very close to Ingham and other local villages. A consultation is open and you can find out more at (www.cottamsolar.co.uk / www.westburtonsolar.co.uk).

FRESH from ALISON'S KITCHEN

This one will set the mouth-watering for a delicious light (ish) bite on a Saturday lunchtime while watching Jeff Stelling and his Gillette Soccer panellists. Unbelievable.

Ingredients:

- 11/21b (650g) flank steak, sliced against the grain
- 1½lb (650g) baby yellow potatoes, quartered
- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 3 tbsp butter, divided
- 5 garlic cloves, minced
- 1 tsp fresh thyme, chopped
- 1 tsp fresh rosemary, chopped
- 1 tsp fresh oregano, chopped
- Salt and fresh cracked pepper
- Crushed red chilli pepper flakes (optional)





Marinade

⅓ cup soy sauce (or coconut amino for paleo & gluten-free)
1 tbsp olive oil
1 tbsp hot sauce eg sriracha
Fresh cracked pepper

Method:

- 1. Combine the steak strips with soy sauce, olive oil, pepper and hot sauce; set aside and allow to marinate while the potatoes are cooking
- 2. In a large skillet over medium-high heat, mix 1 tbsp olive oil and 1 tbsp butter; when the butter is melted add potato wedges. Cook for around 4 mins, stir and cook an additional 4-5 mins until the wedges are golden and fork-tender. Transfer sautéed potatoes to a plate and set aside.
- 3. Keep the same skillet over medium heat and add the remaining 2 tbsp of butter, garlic, red chilli pepper flakes and fresh herbs. Place the steak strips in one layer in the skillet, keeping the drained steak marinade for later. Cook the steak strips on each side for one min each until browned.
- 4. Stir in the reserved marinade and cook for 1 min; add the potato wedges back to the pan and heat through seasoning with salt and pepper as desired.
- 5. Serve with a garnish of sprinkled parmesan cheese if you like.

The Cammeringham Brooch

In September 2019, a group of metal detectorists, with the landowner's permission, discovered a collection of weapons and dress accessories in a field near Cammeringham in Lincolnshire. Recognising their significance, the detectorists contacted Lincolnshire County Council (LCC) and the Portable Antiquities Scheme (PAS), to inform them of their exciting discoveries.

The PAS and University of Lincoln analysed, preserved, and restored the finds. Among the pieces was an exquisite copper-alloy, gilded squareheaded brooch, decorated with depictions of animals and humans, including the image of a 'moustached man'. This pagan representation was thought to bring good luck to the wearer, so it was readily adopted as the project's logo!

The cemetery was at risk and with the support of the landowner, a plan was forged between the PAS, LCC, West Lindsey District Council and Historic England. It was hoped to be a community event, but this could not happen due to the pandemic. However, it was professionally excavated by Network Archaeology in the summer of 2020 and thousands of people locally, nationally and globally followed the discoveries through the Searching for Saxons Facebook page.

Cammeringham traces its roots back to the Anglo-Saxon period and is one of a series of villages situated along a spring line below the Lincoln Edge. The excavation discovered 24 burials containing both skeletons and cremations. Many of the people buried in the cemetery had objects placed with them and a total of 150 items were recovered. These artefacts included brocches, weaponry, decorated beads, pottery and even glass. One of the women was found with a pair of girdle-hangers (pictured below), whose shape imitates that of keys and is thought to symbolise the power women held within the household.

The cremation burials were placed in the ground within beautifully decorated urns and contained grave goods some of which had been burned. These find included beads, tweezers and a bone comb.

Scampton Parish Council

The meeting held on Thursday 7th October 2021 opened with a minute's silence in memory of past Council Chairman, Mel Deacon, who had died last month.

PCSO Julie McFaul reported the theft of 1 tonne dumper from the building site in Scampton Village on 06.09.21

Steve Ulyat reported that he had finished the work on the lamp posts and that they were all now in good order. He recommended regular monitoring of their condition. The Chairman thanked him for all his work in maintaining the posts. Steve suggested that the PC contact Lincolnshire Wild Life Trust with a view to planting some wild flower verges. Cllr Sneath would contact them and Highways to see what was possible. Cllr Sneath reported that another speed check had been carried out and that 8 people had been caught doing speeds between 36 and 52 mph. They would be receiving letters. More checks were planned.

Bus Shelters - After discussion it was proposed by Cllr Patterson that:

1. Salt and vinegar, in larger quantities, be bought for the eradication of ash trees in the base of the millennium shelter.

2. That McNally's be asked to come and clean the shelter again.

3. That the wooden shelter by the church be painted with the preservative that had been bought from Knight's, the suppliers of the shelter.

This was seconded by Cllr Bulteel and agreed unanimously.

Litter picks were being held on a regular basis both at RAF Scampton and in the village and all the volunteers were thanked for making a real difference to the environment. It was suggested that coffee and tea might be provided and this would be looked into. The next event at RAF Scampton would probably be held in November.

<u>Closure of RAF Scampton</u> – The first meeting had been held where members of the Parish Council had been involved with other partners. It is still early days but please rest assured that they are working to ensure the best outcome for the residents of both communities.

<u>Footpath</u> –There were still concerns about the long term stability of the foot-path at the back of the new houses and Highways would be contacted again. Permission had not been sought from the PC for the path which had appeared across the south end of the green. Ownership of the land would be clarified and also whether permission had been gained from the relevant authority.

The Clerk would ascertain whether a joint event between the church and the PC could be organised for the Christmas Tree light up.

Cllr Patterson had little to report but mentioned the plans for the solar power farms to replace Cottam and West Burton power stations. Please see press releases.

A request was received from Charlie Hebborn on behalf of Scampton C of E Primary School for the display of a banner on the bus shelter – Granted.

Letter from resident of RAF Scampton about rubbish accumulating on land near their house. The PC had no authority to act as it was on Annington's land and were unable to reply as no contact details had been provided.

E-SCOOTERS- Please note that E-Scooters can only be used on private land, with the consent of the land owner. They are illegal to use on public roads, including pavements. If used illegally or inappropriately Police have the power to seize e-scooters and issues fines, penalty points. Welton/Hernswell beat team have already responded to complaints and dealt with offenders accordingly.
