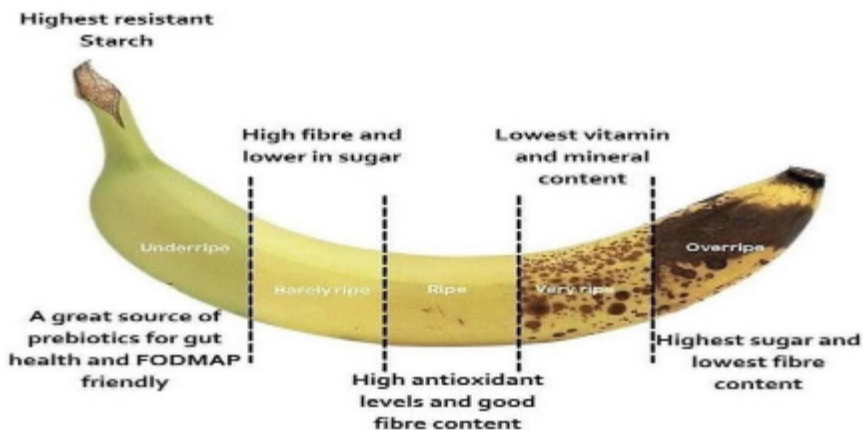

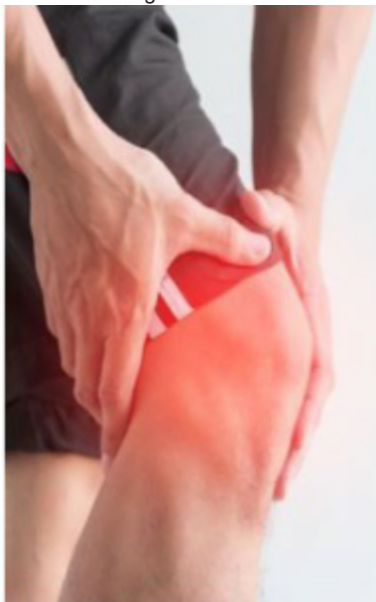

As I am sure you are aware, there will be countrywide Platinum Jubilee celebrations this year. The Parish Council have engaged with the Village Hall Committee to plan our own celebration event in Ingham in early June. Recreation area project: The Parish Council are very excited to announce that they have been successful in applying for £73,205.46 from FCC Communities Foundation, necessary to deliver the play park project. The Parish Council believe that the new play park will make a huge difference to the lives of people living in the area. FCC Communities Foundation is a not for profit business that awards grants for community projects through the Landfill Communities Fund. We will now work with the selected contractor to start scheduling the project delivery.

The speed indicator device records the speed of vehicles approaching and a report is received each month based on this data each month. During February/ March, the average speed on Church Hill was 36.1mph with some some high speeds around 55 mph. Thank you to every driver who adheres to the speed limits around the village. You are helping to keep us all safe.

*While there is evidence that our relationship with wolves stretches back 400,000 years, our domestication*

*of dogs coincides with the evolution of early breeds of dogs about 150,000 years ago. The first special relationship between a dog and a blind person is lost in the mists of time, but perhaps the earliest recorded example is depicted in a first-century AD mural in the buried ruins of Roman Herculaneum.*

*The modern guide dog story, however, begins during*

*the First World War, with thousands of soldiers returning from the Front blinded, often by poison gas. A German doctor, Doctor Gerhard Stalling, got the idea of*



*training dogs en masse to help those affected. While walking with a patient one day through the hospital grounds, he was called away urgently and left his dog with the patient as company. When he returned, he saw signs, from the way the dog was behaving, that it was looking after the blind patient.*

*Dr Stalling started to explore ways of training dogs to become reliable guides and in August 1916 opened the world's first guide dog school for the blind in Oldenburg. The school grew and many new branches opened in Bonn, Breslau, Dresden, Essen, Freiburg, Hamburg, Magdeburg, Münster and Hannover, training up to 600 dogs a year. These schools provided dogs not only to ex-servicemen, but also to blind people in Britain, France, Spain, Italy, the United States, Canada and the Soviet Union.*



*The success of what was happening in the United States encouraged Eustis to set up a guide dog school at Vevey in Switzerland in 1928. She called this school, like the one a year later in New Jersey, 'L'Oeil qui Voit', or The Seeing Eye (the name comes from the Old Testament of the Bible – 'the hearing ear and the seeing eye', Proverbs, XX, 12).*



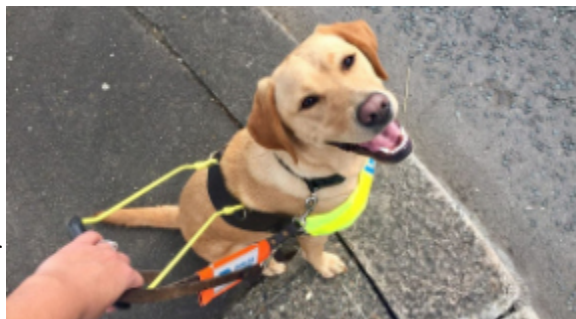
*The schools in Vevey, New Jersey and Italy were the first guide dog schools of the modern era that have survived the test of time.*



*In 1930, two British women, Muriel Crooke and Rosamund Bond, heard about The Seeing Eye and contacted Dorothy Eustis, who sent over one of her trainers. In 1931, the first four British guide dogs completed their training and three years later The Guide Dogs for the Blind Association was founded in the UK.*

*Since then, guide dog schools have opened all round the world, and more open their doors every decade. Thousands of people have had their lives transformed by guide*

*dogs, thanks to the organisations that provide them. The commitment of the people who work for these organisations, and the people who financially support them, is as deep today as it ever was, and the heirs of Dorothy Eustis's legacy continue*



*to work for the increased mobility, dignity and independence of blind and partially-sighted people the world over. The movement goes on.....*

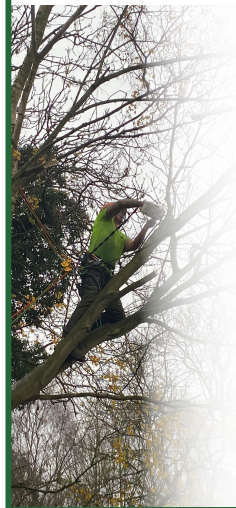

4. **Minutes of the last meeting (7<sup>th</sup> February 2022):** As a point of clarification, it was confirmed that when the Parish meeting does not have any comments on a planning application, then no repose is formally given to that effect.
5. **Matters arising from the minutes not covered elsewhere in the meeting:** None
6. **Reports:**
  - I. Police: Hare Coursing warning sign has been replaced. No other items to report.
  - II. Finance: No expenditure for the Parish Meeting for February. For the Village Hall, £18.80 received from the Coffee Morning. Expenditure £240 plaster, £35 Firestop Services, £88 Gas / Electric. Financial Plan & budget is to be reviewed and updated over the coming meetings. Current version to be circulated for comment. Agreement to include cutting of the grass in St. Andrews Church. Separate account to be set up for the Beer Club. Separate Hall Hire amount received by St Andrews Church in error, awaiting correction.

## *FRESH from ALISON'S KITCHEN*

With Easter just around the corner, here's an appropriate dish for you to try with plenty of goodness to it. Swap the traditional coq for rabbit in this rich French stew made with shallots, carrots, bacon and mushrooms in a red wine sauce

### Ingredients

450g shallots	25g butter , plus a knob
2 onions , thinly sliced	1 tbsp olive oil
2 celery sticks, thinly sliced	600ml full-bodied red wine
300g carrots , thickly sliced	400ml chicken stock
200g pack unsmoked bacon	2 bay leaves
lardons or streaky bacon extra to garnish	Few thyme sprigs , plus
2 tbsp plain flour , seasoned well	300g button mushrooms
3 wild rabbits , jointed into shoulders, legs and saddle pieces (mine were 600g each, gutted weight, no heads)

### Method

- **STEP 1**

Soak the shallots in boiling water for 5 mins, drain, then peel – this makes it a lot easier to remove the skins. While they are soaking, slice the rest of the vegetables. Heat a large, wide flameproof casserole dish, then add the lardons. Fry for 5 mins or until the fat has run from the meat, then tip in the vegetables and cook for 10 mins until golden and starting to soften. Tip into a bowl.

- **STEP 2**

Toss the rabbit meat with the flour, then tap off the excess. Heat half the butter and oil in the dish, then brown half the rabbit for 10 mins until golden all over. Add a good splash of water, scrape around the dish and tip the juices into a jug. Repeat with the second batch of rabbit, but use the wine to deglaze the pan this time, letting it reduce by about a third.

- **STEP 3**

Add the rabbit and the vegetables to the wine, pour in the stock, stir in the herbs and bring to a simmer. Cover, leaving just a small gap for steam to escape, then simmer for 1½-2 hrs or until the meat falls away from the bones. If you like a thicker sauce to your stew, you can lift out the meat and vegetables and boil the sauce to thicken it a little. To finish, heat the knob of butter in a frying pan and cook the mushrooms with salt, pepper and a few thyme leaves over a high heat until browned. Spoon these over the stew, sprinkle with thyme leaves and bring to the table.
