Ingham Parish Council Update

This update is based on decisions made at the meeting of the Parish Council on 11th July 2022 and actions since. You can find the most recent agreed minutes on the Parish Council website <u>https://ingham.parish.lincolnshire.gov.uk</u> and the Parish Council noticeboard.

Recreation area project: The works have begun and we hope that these will be complete during August. We are planning to have an opening ceremony once the inspection of the equipment is complete and signed off. We hope you love our new play park!

Neighbourhood Plan: The steering committee last met in July and have agreed the timeline with Openplan Consultants for the coming 9 month period. A summary of public responses from the public event held in April has been produced and this will now be analysed and any preferences identified. Funding has been agreed from Locality for the coming year and technical support has been successfully applied for to establish design codes for the three different character areas in the village. We aim to review the objectives and strategy in September and complete the policies and draft plan in October. A consultation launch event will be scheduled for November.

The Parish Council have been invited to respond to the consultation for the Cottam and West Burton solar projects. There are concerns about the low key consultation with our Parish considering that parts of it will border our parish boundary and also the scale of these proposed developments. It is understood that the County Council and District Council will oppose these plans and we are supporting this view.

The issue of speeding in and around the village has been a continuous concern, particularly since the acquisition of a speed indicator device which provides speed data to us. We have been made aware of the Community Speed Watch scheme offered by Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership. This allows trained volunteers to undertake visible speed checks at the roadside in a controlled and authorised manner within the parish. The police will train and monitor parish volunteers to carry out speed checks. The police will send letters of advice to the registered keeper of any vehicle exceeding the speed limit. Speed enforcement of course will remain the responsibility of Lincolnshire Police and will continue to be carried out by trained police officers. If any parishioner would be interested in volunteering, please let the Clerk know.

PKF Littlejohn are our appointed external auditor and they have found that our accounts and processes are in accordance with Proper Practices and no other matters have come to their attention that give cause for concern that relevant legislation and regulatory requirements have not been met. A closure of audit notice will be posted on the noticeboard and parish website.

Sadly, Councillor Robin Graham has resigned from the Parish Council and we thank him for his time and expertise during his time with us. There are now two vacancies for the position of Councillor. If you would like to find out more about the role, please contact the Clerk.

"We do the jobs you hate"......

To the people of the Springline Parish and nearby villages.

It is important you should read this, as it concerns you if you live in Ingham or one of our neighbouring villages.

What you are about to read, maybe familiar to you: in fact you may know more it than I, as I am a newcomer to Ingham.

For nearly a decade, the members of All Saints church have been planning to make alterations to the church building in an effort to bring it more up to date, more acceptable to the people who would like to use it. The term or word being adopted is, 'Reordering'. I need to say right away that its original use is for the worship of God and that won't change. The main 'idea' laid out some years ago, hasn't changed either, that is to make the building more user friendly to the community of Ingham and other villages surrounding us.

The village hall serves the communities well to an extent, but only available when the primary school isn't using it, outside school hours. This limits the availability for people needing to hire a space in the neighbouring villages during school times. We think that installing the necessary facilities in the church building will avail an alternative space for corporate or private gatherings to hire.

The previous plan submitted, which was to build an extension onto the west facing porch, has stalled for various reasons. The new proposal for the re-ordering is to use the area immediately inside the church, under the Minstrel's Gallery with a kitchenette on one side and a disabled toilet on the other. The pews would be removed and replaced with stackable chairs, giving a flexible zone in the body of the church for activities. This means of course the floor would be levelled, and heating will be looked at. The outside path through the trees from the gate to the porch would be resurfaced with lighting installed.

The new working group has given itself twelve months to start work on the project, the clock is ticking! We are a small church community and the work is complex, we can only do so much on our own. To make it work for the benefit for all of us we need your support and help. Please don't stop reading now. <u>IT'S NOT ALL ABOUT MONEY</u>. It's still a big ask though. **Unfortunately the project cannot continue without a Treasurer or a Secretary**, as both will be moving on very shortly. Is there any way we can overcome this dilemma. We can't raise them from our own community, is there any one you may know in your street, family, work place, church or Parish Council who can help, please don't leave it to someone else. We have asked this of you good people many times before; I'm standing by my 'phone!

A Word from the Rural Dean Designate

There'Do not be afraid' – words that echo through the Bible. They are used by God to individuals and to whole people groups, Jesus uses them to individuals and to his friends and followers. I don't know about you but when I hear the words 'You don't need to worry, but...' or 'Don't be afraid' – I suddenly begin to wonder what there is to worry about or be afraid of and start worrying.... I guess its part of the human condition. I also think that when we look around at the world at the moment, there is much anxiety and much uncertainty.

What as Christians do we do with that uncertainty - how do we take that command of Jesus to 'not be afraid', because nowhere in the Bible does it tell us that being a follower of Christ means that we are immune to the difficulties of life. The key to that is in lesus words in Luke's gospel: 'Do not be afraid: it is the Father's good pleasure to give you the Kingdom'. What is the Kingdom? Well, the Kingdom is not about the future - it is about now, and the key to that Kingdom is love. You are loved, by a God who goes by such familiar names as Father and Mother. You are loved by Jesus who calls you friend. You are loved by the One who made everything and promises a Kingdom of justice and love. You are loved and therefore you can let the fear roll away and let loose your fingers from the things to which you cling and live a non-possessive life. For, we are at our best when we live non-possessive lives. We become more welcoming and hospitable. We forgive more freely. We're more generous with our time, money, and resources. We love more extravagantly. We see more clearly our deep interconnection with and need of others. A non-possessive life deepens our conversations and intimacy. We handle conflict and differences in better and more productive ways. We open our hearts and minds to other people and new possibilities. We're more creative and less judgemental of ourselves and others. Isn't that a picture of Jesus – a non-possessive life – Kingdom life. The one who gave His life on a cross, the one who sought to serve, the one whose love broke death, the one whose invitation was to all - no matter who they were or are; the one who deliberately and intentionally went to the outcasts, the one who set people free, who prayed, who forgave, who challenged those who believed they possessed God, the one who journeyed with people, the one who offered conversation and encounter. That was and is Kingdom - for that is love.

E-Scooters

You are only allowed to ride an e-scooter on private land with the landowner's permission.

It is against the law to ride an e-scooter on public land including pavements, cycle lanes, beach promenades, bridleways, or any public accessible land such as parks and car parks.

Why is this?

E-scooters are classified as Personal Light Electric Vehicles. This means they are treated as motor vehicles and have to keep to the same legal requirements.

Where can I ride my e-scooter?

It is against the law to ride an e-scooter on public land including pavements, cycle lanes, roads, beach promenades, bridleways, or any publicly accessible land such as parks and car parks.

What happens if I'm caught?

You must stop using your e-scooter on public land immediately. The police can issue you a warning, can seize your scooter and the rider may also be liable for prosecution for traffic offences.

The Ingham recreation area improvement is a step closer now that the work has begun for new play equipment at the Ingham Recreation Area.

The project, which is being funded by a £73,205.76 grant from FCC Communities Foundation, will provide a exciting array of new equipment for toddlers through to teens including an agility trail, tree climber, trampoline, somersault bars, play towers with a track ride and equipment for disabled use along with safety surfaces.

Glentworth Parish Council Update

This update is based on the decisions and discussions at the last meeting of the Parish Council on 29th June 2022 and actions since. A full copy of Minutes can be found on the Parish Council website or noticeboard.

Work on the Recreation Area Project begun in early August and was due to take 2 to 3 weeks to complete. There will be a new climbing frame, play boat and somersault bars along with new play surfaces and seating. We hope to hold an opening ceremony once the park is complete and inspected. We hope you all enjoy the new park.

The Parish Council have ordered a new community noticeboard which will be sited close to the Parish Council noticeboard on Stoney Lane. This will be unlocked and therefore accessible to all parishioners who may want to post notices about community events or important community messages.

As part of the Platinum Jubilee commemoration the Parish Council were successful in achieving funding to purchase a new tree and wildlife notice for the Pocket Park. We hope that this will enhance this under used area. We hope to improve the pond area in due course once advice has been sought.

The Parish Council have been made aware of the proposed Tillbridge Solar project which seeks to locate a large number of solar panels close to our village and on land between us and Corringham. Before we respond to a consultation we wanted to gauge your opinions in the village and therefore we have circulated a brief questionnaire to all households. outbreak was nothing compared with Man flu. At least we seem to have got over it and normal service is starting to resume, beginning with this tasty feast of braised pork chops, quaranteed to perk you up.

Braised Pork Chops with Apples

Ingredients

• 1 teaspoon sunflower oil

- 2 lean boneless pork chops (fat removed) or lean boneless pork loin chops or steaks (about 150q/5 1/2oz each)
- 2-3 shallots, thinly sliced
- 85g (3oz) mushrooms, sliced
- 2 teaspoons plain flour
- 100ml (3 1/2fl oz) vegetable stock
- 4 tablespoon dry cider (or apple juice)
- 1 teaspoon wholegrain mustard, or to taste
- 1 large eating apple, peeled, cored and thickly sliced



Method

1. Preheat oven to 180°C/fan 160 °C/gas mark 4. Heat oil in a non-stick frying pan. Add pork; cook over a medium-low heat until sealed all over. Transfer to an ovenproof casserole dish.

2. Add shallots and mushrooms to frying pan; cook for 5 minutes. Add flour; cook gently for 1 minute, stirring. Slowly add stock and cider, stirring; add mustard and black pepper. Bring to the boil; continue stirring for 2-3 minutes or until thickened slightly.

3. Place apple slices on pork; pour over sauce. Cover and cook in oven for 45-60 minutes or until pork is tender. Serve with boiled new potatoes and plenty of vegetables.
