Revd Canon Penny Green

By the time you read this, a significant period in our history will have passed. The death of the late Queen Elizabeth II came suddenly and as a nation we will have observed a period of mourning. This has been a strange period of time in some ways. We are not accustomed to mourning as a nation, but at the same time, life continued. Some of us sat glued to our TVs, others made a pilgrimage to London to be a part of something and to pay their respects.

This whole period has made me think about our need to connect with each other and to belong. I have always believed that we are created to live in community. We are interdependent. We learned that again through the period of the pandemic, but we know it every day. As we progress, we are now even more aware that we are a part of a global community. One of the things that struck me about tributes to the Queen was that they came from all over the world. She was not someone who only had an impact on those with whom she had direct contact. She had influence over people across the world – her words, her faith and her legacy have set a tone for so many people.

In a Christmas address she commented that millions of people follow the teaching of Jesus Christ, and that she was one of them. She owned her belief, her faith and her need to belong. We all need that don't we? We all have a need to belong to something, or someone. For those with faith that is a belonging to someone beyond themselves. Often people ask me why I joined the church. To be honest, the Church for me is secondary to my belonging to lesus. It was lesus, Son of God, who changed my life, it is my belonging to Him that has shaped who I am and who has given me an identity as a child of God. To whom or what do you belong?

Glentworth Parish Council Update

This update is based on the decisions and discussions at the last meeting of the Parish Council and actions since. A full copy of Minutes can be found on the Parish Council website or noticeboard.

Glentworth Parish Council were deeply saddened to hear of the passing of the Queen. The thoughts of Councillors are with the Royal Family at this time. A book of condolence has been available at St. Michaels Church during the period of mourning.

Work on the Recreation Area Project begun in early August however, despite good early progress, there have been a few delays due to the weather and over-runs on other projects. The project, which is being funded by a £16,957 grant from FCC Communities Foundation, will provide a new climbing frame, play boat, somersault bars and seating. John Latham, Chairman of Glentworth Parish Council is excited that the project is starting to take shape. He says: "It's great to see our vision for this vital community facility moving closer to reality. We are extremely grateful for the funding FCC Communities Foundation has given us and we're looking forward to opening to the public." FCC Communities Foundation is a not-for-profit business that awards grants for community projects through the Landfill Communities Fund. An opening ceremony will be arranged once the park is complete and inspected. We hope you all enjoy the new park.

The Parish Council have been made aware of the proposed Tillbridge Solar project which seeks to locate a large number of solar panels close to our village and on land between us and Corringham. A questionnaire has been circulated to the community to gauge opinions before the Parish Council agree any comments. If you have not been able to complete this or have lost a copy please send an email to the Clerk.

We have also been made aware of plans to install further oil well close to the existing wells on Northlands Road. We are hoping representatives of IGas will join a Parish Council meeting soon to reveal more information.

- Basil, for garnish
- Freshly grated Parmesan, for garnish

Method

- 1. In a large pot of boiling water, cook spaghetti according to package directions. Reserve 240ml pasta water then drain spaghetti.
- 2. In a large pan over medium heat, heat oil then add garlic and cook

until fragrant, 1 minute. Add courgette, carrots, pepper and red onion and cook until soft, 7 minutes. Stir in tomato paste then add chopped tomatoes and season with Italian seasoning, chilli flakes, salt, and pepper; simmer 10 minutes.

- 3. Add spaghetti to pan and 120ml of reserved pasta water and toss to combine. Add more pasta water as necessary to bring sauce together.
- 4. Garnish with basil and Parmesan to serve.

Ingham Parish Council Update

This update is based on decisions made at the last meeting of the Parish Council and actions since. You can find the most recent agreed minutes on the Parish Council website https://ingham.parish.lincolnshire.gov.uk and the Parish Council noticeboard.

It is with deep sadness and regret that the news of the death of our Queen Elizabeth II was received. The Parish Council arranged for the flag on The Green to be flown at half-mast for the appropriate length of time. A book of condolence has been available in All Saints Church for parishioners to record their messages. We thank Mr Corringham and All Saints Church for their help with these matters.

Recreation area project: The new Ingham Play Park is now open and its fantastic to see so many of you there. An official opening ceremony will be arranged at the play park and the District Councillor, County Councillor, FCC Communities grant manager, staff and children from the school and other community members will be invited to attend. Mark Nicholson, Chairman of Ingham Parish Council, is delighted that the play park is now in use. He says: "This vital facility is going to make a real difference to those who use it, as well as the wider Ingham community. We are extremely grateful to FCC Communities Foundation for providing funding as we would not have been able to go ahead without its support." FCC Communities Foundation is a not-for-profit business that awards grants for community projects through the Landfill Communities Fund

The tennis court was temporarily closed to the public during late August and early September so that pest control measures could be undertaken. You will be pleased to hear that there is no longer any sign of pest activity. The tennis court is now open to parishioners and is free to use.

Neighbourhood Plan: The steering committee last met in September and were joined by Openplan Consultants. The strategic objectives and vision statement were reviewed and a timeline for completion has been agreed. It is hoped we will be at regulation 14 stage by year end. A grant from Locality has been successfully applied for along with funding for a design code review.

We have been made aware of the Community Speed Watch scheme offered by Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership. This allows trained volunteers to undertake visible speed checks at the roadside in a controlled and authorised manner within the parish. The police will train and monitor parish volunteers to carry out speed checks. The police will send letters of advice to the registered keeper of any vehicle exceeding the speed limit. Speed enforcement of course will remain the responsibility of Lincolnshire Police and will continue to be carried out by trained police officers. If any parishioner would be interested in volunteering, please let the Clerk know.
